Evaluation of the abovementioned tenders was done on the 21st of November 2025. It was noted that only one supplier namely; Cooley Somsak Medical responded to tender for the Supply and Delivery of Laboratory Drugs and Reagents and the committee agreed to let the bidder to be added to the framework, four suppliers namely; Aravas. STM, Pharmadist and Limael (PVT) (LTD) responded to tender for the Supply and delivery of Pharmaceutical drugs and two suppliers namely; Aravas Pvt Ltd and Pharmadist Pvt Ltd were not considered since they were already shortlisted. STM and Limael Pvt Ltd were rejected for they were not compliant to administrative requirements and the committee recommended that the institution engages Cooley Somsak Medical and enter into framework agreements with them and also open up the process so as to on board more suppliers on the Framework tender for Supply and Delivery of Laboratory Drugs and Reagents within ninety days so as to create competition. Ltd bids were rejected for failure to meet administrative requirements.

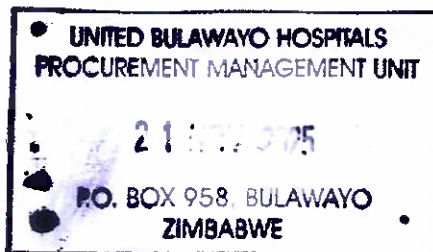

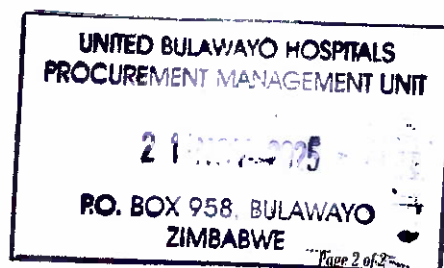

THE Government's decision to operationalise the reserved sectors policy framework marks an important step in its long-standing desire to mainstream local participation in the economy.

At a time when more than 90 per cent of domestic economic activity occurs informally, the policy aims to shift the balance by creating economic space for locals to operate businesses in areas hitherto reserved for foreign investors, with remaining open to foreign capital, strategic, and capital-intensive sectors.

Announcing the decision during the post-Cabinet briefing last week, Information, Publicity and Broadcasting Services Minister Dr Justin Maseko said the reserved areas policy would apply to industries with low barriers to entry such as artisanal mining, fisheries, advertising, transport, beauty services and retail pharmacies, among others.

Cabinet Minister, he stressed, was not to shut out foreign investment, but to ensure that locals have guaranteed access to the mainstream economy.

Minister Dr Prosper Chikwambira believes the policy, if implemented carefully, could have a transformative impact on the structure of the economy.

"Reserved sectors are a practical instrument for inclusive growth," he explained.

"They allow governments to ring-fence opportunities for their citizens, particularly in low-capital industries where foreign participation often squanders local funds.

"For an economy like Zimbabwe's, where informality is dominant, this framework creates an avenue for small players to graduate into the formal economy."

Dr Chikwambira added that such frameworks also encourage tax compliance and widen the revenue base as more businesses are drawn into the formal fold.

He, however, cautioned that enforcement would be key, noting that without a robust monitoring system, the risk is that the policy remains on paper while control is retained by better-resourced external players through proxies.

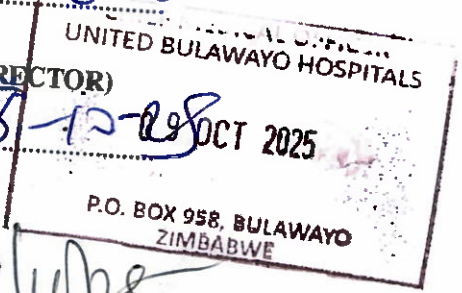
